Regular Board Meeting
Board of Trustees of the Village of St. Anne
Kankakee County, Illinois
Village Hall, May 9, 2022

President O'Connell called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Clerk Sutherland called the roll, and the following trustees answered present: Grubbs, Wendt, Farber, Stam, O'Connell and Abrassart. Clerk Sutherland reported the roll, and President O'Connell declared that a quorum existed for the transaction of public business. Also present at the meeting were Police Chief Todd Navratil, Public Works Director Don Leveque, Attorney Dana Meyer and Treasurer Sue Bonvallet. Also present was Rev. Randy Knoll. Engineer Neil Piggush and Illinois State Representative candidate Frederick Walls.

CALL TO ORDER

ROLL CALL-QUORUM

VISITORS

Frederick Walls introduced himself as a candidate running for Illinois State Representative. He stated his concerns from what he fears is happening within the state government and feels that his values and morals would make him a good choice for the poor and middle class.

PUBLIC COMMENT F.WALLS

President O'Connell asked if there were any questions or corrections to the minutes of the 4-11, 2022 regular meeting. Hearing none, he asked for a motion to approve them. It was moved by Trustee Abrassart and seconded by Trustee Stam that the minutes be approved. Upon voice vote, all trustees present voted favorably, and President O'Connell declared the motion passed.

4/11/2022 REG. MTG.MINS APPROVED

Treasurer Bonvallet reported on the Village accounts. President O'Connell then asked if there were any questions or comments on her report. Hearing none, he asked for a motion to approve the report. It was moved by Trustee Abrassart and seconded by Trustee Stam that the treasurer's report be approved. After a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried. Treasurer Bonvallet went on to report that the outstanding water bill balance continues to go down.

Clerk Sutherland informed the Board that the Village Garage Sale applications were coming in and she expected atleast 20.

President O'Connell distributed a handout on current items. (attached)

After a discussion on the matter, President O'Connell asked for a motion to hire R.O.V. to inspect and clean the water tower, with a cost of not more than \$5,000.

Motion was made by Trustee Farber, seconded by Trustee O'Connell, and after a roll call vote where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried.

President O'Connell then referred to Treasurer Bonvallet to describe the planters that the Beautification Committee would like to enhance the downtown area. Afterwards, he asked for a motion to purchase the new planters at a cost of not more than \$2,500. Motion was made by Trustee Grubbs, seconded by Trustee Stam, and after a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried.

DOWNTOWN PLANTERS PURCHASED

President O'Connell asked for input from Engineer Neil Piggush regarding the bids on the Phase I of the Water Project. Piggush remarked that he was shocked at how high the bids were. He did state he had concerns with the Village not accepting a bid at this time, that the prices may go even higher and that there was risk of losing the \$400,000 forgiveness that had been granted to the Village. Trustee Abrassart made the motion to award the project to R&R, Inc at a cost of \$2,453,413.55. This was seconded by Trustee O'Connell and after a roll call vote, where 4 of the 6 Board members voted favorably, the motion was carried Trustees Farber and Grubbs voted Present.

President O'Connell asked for a motion to pass the Loan Agreement Ordinance 2022-01 that will cover the financing of the Phase I @Water project. The motion was made by Trustee Wendt, seconded by Trustee O'Connell and after a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried.

President O'Connell stated that Attorney Meyer has filed the Wilkening property deed.

President O'Connell reported to the Board that he felt many great ideas were shared at the Downtown Project meeting that was held May 5, 2022. There were about 24 local citizens at the meeting.

President O'Connell opened discussion on getting a digital sign for the Village. Everyone agreed it would be a great addition to the town for many reasons.

Discussion was also shared that there are a few properties around town that need attention as far as upkeep of their yards. Chief Navratil would be addressing this.

UNKEPT PROPERTY

Attorney Meyer stated that this will probably be her last meeting and that she is working on all loose ends. She would work with President O'Connell to fill her position.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Trustee Farber gave the police report. He read the report as follows: 27 traffic citations, 28 written warnings, 0 ordinance tickets, 1 misdemeanor traffic arrests, 0 DUI arrests, 1 accident report, 1 towed vehicle, 13 general case reports, 50 miscellaneous reports, 1 felony arrest, 0 misdemeanor arrests and 1 warrant arrest. There have been 24 agency assists. There have been 51 traffic stops. Officers worked 672 regular hours, 32.25 overtime hours and 12 holiday hours. There was \$0 for the vehicle fund, \$885.49 in fines, \$30.00 in ecitation funds, \$0 in administrative vehicle seizures, \$0 In Sex/Violent Offender registration, \$0 in warrant fees and \$915.49 disbursement from the County Clerk. There was \$280 collected in golf cart fees collected. Papineau reimbursed the Village \$575.

POLICE REPORT:

POLICE DOORS

Chief Navratil provided quotes for new doors at the Police Station. No decisions have been made.

Trustee Wendt stated that his commission had nothing to report at this time.

PUBLIC WORKS RPT:

Trustee Stam stated he did not have a building permit report to report this month. He has been working with the RR with hopes to get the old Finally Mary's torn down.

LICENSE & HEALTH RPT:

Trustee O'Connell made motion to hire Rollins Aquatic Solutions to treat the Village ponds for weed control at a cost of \$2,875. It was seconded by Trustee Wendt and after a roll call vote where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried.

PARKS & BUILDING RPT. WEED TREATMENT

Trustee Abrassart had nothing from his commission to report.

Trustee Grubbs reported that the bills had been examined by committee and recommended approval for payment. It was moved by Trustee Grubbs and seconded by Trustee Stam that the above recommendation be approved and the bills authorized for payment. Upon roll call vote, all trustees voted favorably, and President O'Connell declared the motion carried.

EQUIPMENT/CIVIL DEFENSE RPT:

Trustee Grubbs reported that the Finance and Personell Commission had met and their recommendation is a 3% raise for all Full and part time employees including the clerk and treasurer. He made the motion and it was seconded by Trustee Abrassart and after a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried.

Trustee Grubbs then made a motion to hire 3 youths to work with the Public Works Dept. through the summer months. The motion was seconded by Trustee O'Connell, and after a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried.

President O'Connell then asked if there was any further public business to come before the board. Hearing none, he asked for a motion to adjourn. It was moved by Trustee Stam and seconded by Trustee Farber that the meeting be adjourned. Upon voice vote, all trustees present voted favorably, and President O'Connell declared the motion carried. The President then adjourned the meeting at 8:11p.m.
