Regular Board Meeting Board of Trustees of the Village of St. Anne Kankakee County, Illinois Village Hall, November 14, 2022

President O'Connell introduced the people present to Steven Moore Jr, an 8th grader from St. Anne Grade School. He then asked Steven to call the meeting to order. Steven called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Clerk Sutherland called the roll, and the following trustees answered present: O'Connell, Wendt, Farber, Stam, and Abrassart. Clerk Sutherland reported the roll, and Acting President Steven Moore Jr. declared that a quorum existed for the transaction of public business. Steven then asked all to stand and join him in the Pledge of Allegiance. Treasurer Bonvallet, Attorney Michael Parish, Public Works Director Don Leveque and Building Inspector David Pomaranski were also in attendance. Chief Navratil was absent.

CALL TO ORDER

Tom Cook from the organization Pray As One was also in attendance. He shared a message with the Board. Also in attendance was Steve, Joy and Sam Moore, Mike

Caraway, Pam Lottinville, Patrolman Eric Wynnand David and Reba Worth.

VISITORS TOM COOK

Mrs. Reba Worth stated to the Board that back in October, 2022, when the hydrants were being flushed and she had an issue with extremely discolored water, she was talking to her neighbor, Blanca Pena, about the water issue. Upon discussing, the cost of the water/sewer/garbage bill came up. At this time, Mrs. Worth discovered that for many years, she was being charged for sewer, when in fact, they have a septic system for their property. After reviewing her old checks, she feels that they have been wrongfully charged since 2010. She has suggested that the Village reduce her bill by \$10 a month from here on or to pay her a lump sum. President O'Connell said their concerns would be looked into and someone would contact them.

RECOGNITION OF PERSONS WITH PRESENTATIONS MR. AND MRS. WORTH

Mike Caraway addressed the Board asking permission to put a memorial on Village property for Chief Dandurand, who was killed in the line of duty, back in 1974. He handed out a packet containing the information he has researched with a detailed description of the design he would like to see erected. The Board was very receptive and grateful to Mike for his work. President O'Connell said the project is long overdue. A motion was made by Trustee Stam granting Caraway permission to continue with his plan and that permission be given for him to put it on Village property at a sight to be determined at a later date. This was seconded by Trustee Farber and after a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried. The project the Board and Caraway both liked has a cost of \$5,132. President O'Connell asked Clerk Sutherland to put that item on the December agenda.

MIKE CARAWAY

President O'Connell asked if there were any questions or corrections to the minutes of the Nov.11, 2022 regular meeting. Hearing none, he asked for a motion to approve them. It was moved by Trustee Abrassart and seconded by Trustee Stam that the minutes be approved. Upon voice vote, all trustees present voted favorably, and President O'Connell declared the motion carried.

Treasurer Bonvallet reported the fund balances. President O'Connell then asked if there were any questions or comments on her report. Hearing none, he asked for a motion to approve the report. It was moved by Trustee Stam and seconded by Trustee Wendt, and after a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably the treasurer's report was approved

TREASURER'S REPORT

Clerk Sutherland reported to the Board that there were some cleaning issues with the Civic Center and she feels like the rent should be raised from \$100 to \$125 for residents and \$175 for non-residents with a sponsor. A motion was made by Trustee Farber, seconded by Trustee Stam to raise the rates for any rentals after January, 2023. After a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried.

CLERK'S REPORT: CIVIC CENTER RENT RAISED

President O'Connellasked for a motion to approve the Pay request #1-Transmittal Letter fr the Water System for \$135,000. The motion was made by Trustee Stam, seconded by Trustee Abrassart, and after a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably.

President O'Connell passed out a handout with current village updates on projects. He referred to another handout from Stewart Signs outlining a design for an electronic sign to serve our village.

President O'Connell stated that he has handed overseeing the demolition of the four recently acquired Village buildings to Trustee Stam..

President O'Connell announced that he and Trustee Stam would be meeting with Jeff meeting to discuss the possibility of a TIF (Tax Increment Financing) plan to make improvements to our downtown.

Attorney Parish reported that the Klonowski deal seems to be very close to being finalized.

Attorney Parish reported that he was working on filing the deed on the Weisbecker property, but there is an issue with who is responsible for the back taxes.

Trustee Farber gave the police report. He read the report as follows: 11 traffic citations, 1 accident report, 22 agency assists. 5 suspicious activity calls, 156 business checks, park checks/ no issues, 11 citations issued, 5 written warnings, 6 traffic citations, 0 warrant arrests. 2 disorderly conduct/disturbance/fireworks calls, 2 battery/agg battery/domestic battery calls. 1 criminal damage to property/vehicle, and 0 theft/identity theft. There was \$12 in e-citation funds, \$70 warrant fees, \$333 disbursement from the County Clerk and \$600 from Papineau.

MONTHLY POLICE REPORT

Trustee Farber asked for a motion for the Board to contribute \$500 to the annual Shop with A Cop program. Students from the St. Anne Grade School are included in the program. This was seconded by Trustee Abrassart and after a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried.

Trustee Farber then gave a short summary of the police hiring search. Farber then made a motion to hire, Joel Macano, as a full time officer for the Village to start as soon as all his background checks are in. This was seconded by Trustee Stam, and after a roll call vote, where all presented voted favorably, the motion was carried.

JOEL MARCANO HIRED AS FT PATROLMAN

Trustee Farber then made a motion to hire Peter Valez as a part time officer with the possibility that we could convert him to Full time sometime. Again, this hire is pending his background checks coming in. This was seconded by Trustee Stam, and after a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried.

Trustee Wendt made a motion to contribute \$6,483.75 toward the large sidewalk and curb replacement project on 6th Avenue on the property of the St. Anne Catholic Church. This was seconded by Trustee Stam, and after a roll call vote where all present voted positive, the motion was passed.

Trustee Stam read a building report stating there was \$1690 in fees collected for job costs totaling \$339,607.

Upon roll call vote, all trustees present voted favorably, and President O'Connell declared the motion carried. Trustee Farber asked for input on Christmas gifts for the Village employees.

At 8:14, Trustee Abrassart made the motion to exit executive session, seconded by Trustee Farber, and after a roll call vote, where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried.

After exiting executive session, Trustee Wendt made a motion to dedicate the pond park to long term village president and trustee Ron Grubbs. This was seconded by Trustee Abrassart, and after a voice vote, where all present voted favorably, the motion was carried.

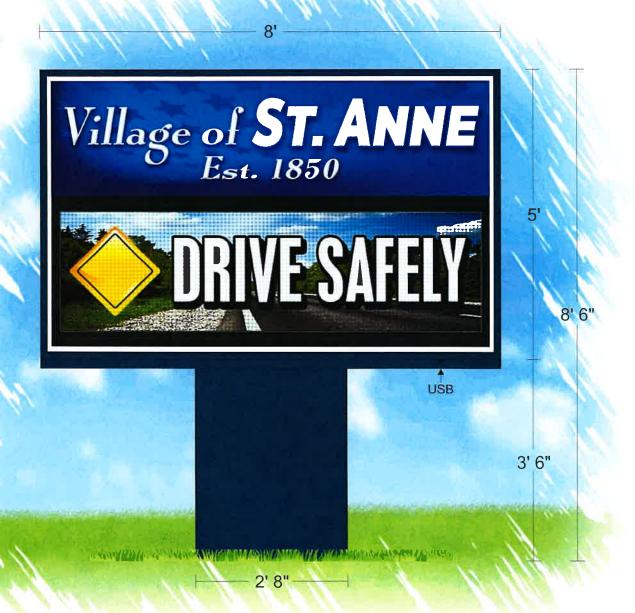
