Chapter 7

OPERATION OF NON HIGHWAY VEHICLES ON STREETS, ROADS, AND HIGHWAYS

9-7-1: Definitions

County Roads Include any county roads within the boundaries of the village limits of St. Anne.

GOLF CART: A vehicle specifically designed and intended for the purpose of transporting one

or more persons and their golf clubs or maintenance equipment. The golf cart shall be equipped with windshield, seat belts, horn, brakes, turn signals, a steering apparatus, tires, a rearview mirror, red reflectorized warning devices in the front and rear, an approved slow moving vehicle emblem on the rear of the

golf cart, a headlight that emits white light visible from a distance of five hundred feet (500') to the front, and a tail lamp that emits a red light visible from at least one hundred feet (100') from the rear, brake lights and turn

signals. The definition of golf cart specifically excludes all-terrain vehicles, ATVs,

or any vehicle that is not a golf cart.

STATE ROADS: Include Illinois Route 1

VILLAGE STREETS: Any of the streets within the boundaries of the village except for state and

county roads (Ord., 9-13-2010)

9-7-2: REQUIREMENTS:

All persons wishing to operate a golf cart on the village streets of the Village of St. Anne must ensure compliance with the following requirements.

- (A) Proof of liability insurance
- (B) Must display village decal on front and rear
- (C) Must be inspected by village police chief or designated representative
- (D) Must have valid driver's license



- (E) When operated on a roadway, a golf cart shall have it's headlight and tail lamps lighted.
- (F) Must obey all traffic laws of the state of Illinois and village of St. Anne.
- (G) Must be sixteen (16) years of age or older
- (H) Side street use only
- (I) No modifications to golf cart suspension
- (J) Must not exceed the posted speed limit.
- (K) May only operate on village streets with the exception of authorized crossing of state and county roads.
- (L) Golf carts may only be operated on designated village streets from sunrise to sunset. They shall not be operated in inclement weather nor when visibility is impaired by weather, smoke, fog, or other conditions, or at any time when there is insufficient light to clearly see persons and vehicles on the roadway at a distance of five hundred feet (500')
- (M) A person who drives or is in actual physical control of the golf cart on a roadway while under the influence is subject to section 11-500 through 11-502 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- (N) Golf carts may not be operated on sidewalks or other public property not accessible to or authorized to vehicular traffic (Ord., 9-13-2010)

9-7-3: PERMITS:

- (A) No person shall operate a motorized golf cart without obtaining a permit from the village clerk as provided herein. Permits shall be granted for a period of one year and may be renewed annually. The cost of a permit is thirty five dollars (\$35). Insurance coverage is to be verified in effect by the village clerk when renewing the permits.
- (B) Every application for a permit shall be made on a form supplied by the village and shall contain the following information
 - (1) The name and address of applicant
 - (2) Name of liability insurance carrier
 - (3) The serial number, make, model and description of the golf cart
 - (4) Signed general release of liability waiver, discharge and covenant not to sue by applicant releasing the village of St. Anne, the county of Kankakee and all other governmental entities which have approved the operation of golf carts on their roadways of and then from all liability for direct, indirect, special, incidental or consequential damages, whether arising in court, contract or any other legal theories in connection with or arising out of the operator's use of a golf cart, and in addition the operator shall save, hold harmless and indemnify such governmental entities against any and all liability, claims, causes of action and costs of whatsoever kind and nature, including, without



being limited to, injury, damage, loss, including death, resulting from, arising out of, or occurring in connection with the use of a golf cart pursuant to this chapter, or any other ordinance of the village of St. Anne

- (5) Photo static copy of applicable liability insurance coverage card specifically for the golf cart to be operated on village streets
- (6) Such other information as the village my require.
- (C) No permit shall be granted unless the following conditions are met:
 - (1) The golf cart must be inspected by the village chief of police (or designee) to ensure that the vehicle is safe to operate on village streets and is in compliance with the requirements of this chapter.
 - (2) The handicapped applicant must submit a certificate signed by a physician, that the handicapped applicant is able to safely operate a motorized golf cart on the roadways designated.
 - (3) The applicant must provide evidence of insurance in compliance with the provisions of Illinois statutes regarding minimum liability insurance for passenger vehicles to be operated on the roads of the state of Illinois

The Village board may suspend or revoke a permit granted hereunder upon a finding that the holder thereof has violated has violated any of the provisions of this chapter or if there is evidence that the permittee cannot safely operate the mobilized golf cart on the designated roadways.

Every person operating a golf cart pursuant to permit hereunder on designated village streets has all the rights and duties applicable to a driver of any other vehicle pursuant to the state highway traffic laws and regulations except when those provisions cannot reasonably be applied to motorized golf carts. (Ord., 9-13-2010)

9-7-4: PENALTY:

Any person who violates any provision of this chapter shall upon conviction be subject to a fine of not less than one hundred seventy five dollars (\$175.00) nor more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00), and the costs of prosecution. (Ord., 9-13-2010)
