## Phase 1 of St. Anne's Water Project

We are at the end of the first phase of the water project: sidewalks, driveway replacements, and landscaping are nearly finished. This was a massive project that took longer than expected and cost somewhat more than expected because the water mains were 100 years old and in very poor condition. The repairs were met with challenges. Fresher water should be the reward for your patience. The water along this route is now in a loop, constantly moving while eliminating the rust build up that we experienced before.

Phase 2 will be bid in late January and should be starting in May or June. This work is exclusively at the Pump House west of town.
