Plant Sale



CDE's:

In FFA, CDE stands for Career Development based on their knowledge and skill in a certain area. A group of St. Anne FFA members have been studying and practicing for Horticulture. This includes various identifications, rankings, a test, and corsage-making. Members will compete at 3 different levels this year, including an invite at JJC, our section competition, and then state. A team will also compete at State Poultry in April. Here, they will grade different carcasses, identify various cuts, and take a general knowledge exam.









CDE's-District and State Proficiency:

FFA members each have an SAE, Supervised Agricultural Event. These are events where members compete Experience, which they must keep a record book on. They may choose to compete with this record book at a Proficiency competition. Here, they are interviewed about their SAE, graded on their record keeping skills, and compared to others with similar projects. This year Maya Anderson and Nathan Brammer both won Section and District, advancing them to compete at state. Anderson's SAE is in Agricultural Sales-Placement, where she had worked for Oosterhoff & Son selling flowers at a farmer's market for multiple years. Brammer's SAE is in Outdoor Recreation, where he works for Lowry's Sled rental, a company that pulls a sled for tractor and truck pulls. Both Anderson & Brammer are in the top 5 in Illinois for their respective SAE project areas.
