President O'Connell stated that we are waiting for Neil to go over the initial plans to see if we want to change anything. We should be able to apply for a matching grant. The grant that Neil is wanting us to apply for

President O'Connell stated that we are waiting on the new generator. Once that arrives the old one will be moved to the Catholic Church and that will complete the deal we entered with the Joliet Dioceses.

PHASE 2 WATER PROJECT

President O'Connell stated we should hear about getting a loan with principal forgiveness after the first of the year.

PHASE 3 WATER PROJECT

President O'Connell informed the board that last week Public Works Director Don Leveque found a leak at the curve of Ambrose St. and 6th Ave. It was discovered that it was an old Transit main that we did not have the knowledge or tools to fix this old piping, so Calumet City Plumbing was called in to do the repairs. It made sense to install a fire hydrant in that area as they were finishing up the work since the hole was already open.

AMBROSE STREET REPAIR

President O'Connell then told the board that he spoke with Fire Chief Tim Douglas concerning old fire hydrants. He asked to get a list of hydrants that need to be replaced and their priority.

FIRE HYDRANTS

Attorney Brasel got the notes from former Attorney Parish, and he is going to get started on the annexation of the property by Dixie Delight.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Trustee Wendt gave the monthly Police report. There was \$500.00 in administrative tow fines, \$0.00 in golf cart fees, \$0.00 in ordinance fines and \$750.00 collected from Papineau for a total of \$1322.26.

Trustee Abrassart reported that there were 5 permits totaling \$91,635.00 with fees of \$800.00.

LICENSE AND HEALTH

Trustee Abrassart also asked President O'Connell if they could meet with Dennis Bonvallet as a committee and bring appointing him as an assistant building inspector to the board next month. President O'Connell agreed with that so that will be revisited next month.
